He is also an endorsed Protestant Chaplain with the 139th Airlift Wing in St. Joseph, MO, and Truman Medical Center in Kansas City, MO.He has served in various ministry roles, from regional to local, bringing innovative and entrepreneurial ideas about the shifting paradigm of church. His talent, tenacity, and experience were recognized in 2016 when the Air National Guard awarded him the Samuel Stone Award.

Some of her most notable achievements include providing scholarships to graduates in need whose parents were incarcerated, helping single mothers obtain school supplies and Christmas toys, assisting single mothers in securing transportation for work through sponsorship, and helping families during hurricane season get necessary supplies. She has also organized and assisted churches with global and local outreaches and collaborated with politicians to bring about community change. Additionally, Rev. Newton has worked with media outlets such as radio and television to highlight the needs of small churches and their communities. As a church administrator, she organized various events to meet the needs of the larger community.
